


# LOCAL ARTISTIC CREATIVITY REMAINS CONTAGIOUS: PASS IT ON

Local residents are all too aware of the pandemic that has punished us for more than two years. But as Covid winds down it is reassuring to see that another healthier reality has maintained its core strength through this adversity and is forging ahead. In Grey-Bruce artistic creativity continues to be contagious. Being around creative, artistic people is extremely infectious. You can just immerse yourself in all the creativity around you, enjoy it and learn from it. Consider the following evidence which just scratches the surface of our community's widespread artistic expression.

If you happened to be in Owen Sound's River District some time from mid January to mid February, did you happen to encounter a tiger – or maybe a pack of them? If so then you had the pleasure of being in the vicinity of the Grey Gallery, the Owen Sound Artists' Coop or The Georgian Bay Centre for the Arts. The outstanding Year of the Tiger art exhibition curated by Raquell Yang and sponsored by the Grey Bruce Chinese Heritage & Culture Association was hosted by Grey Gallery and featured prominently in the other two participating venues. More than 30 local artists each uniquely interpreted the fiery passion and daring of the majestic animal central to the lunar new year.

The inspiring impact of this effective collaboration on Grey-Bruce residents and on the local artistic community adds to an already overwhelming 'mountain of evidence' that local art galleries like Grey Gallery and the Owen Sound Artists' Co-op are much more than just space for retail. Together



with other artistic individuals and organizations they constitute an 'arena for culture'. As these galleries illustrate, what might be labelled the 'art industry' enables individuals to discover things about themselves and share those stories with the world. The art market is a platform for innovation, learning and conversation.

#### **GREY GALLERY**

In 2018 Owen Sound was fortunate that rare book librarian Anne Dondertman and figurative artist John Lauglin chose to transition their successful careers from hectic Toronto. Far from retiring, the couple opted to make a significant commitment to this region's already vibrant artistic community by establishing Grey Gallery in a heritage building on 2nd Avenue East in the City's - then promising, now thriving - River District. As Anne explains the move, "John and I recognized from our Toronto experience that bigger isn't always better. What Owen Sound lacks in population size, it makes up for with a big arts scene – musicians, visual artists and writers.

Four years later the couple live and work in the charming, renovated Coates and Best building and offer ever changing curated collections including but not limited to fine art, paintings, figurative work, carvings and sculptures. A large collection of books about art includes many out of print items. The books are available for browsing and musing, not purchase. It's rewarding to John and me to push the boundaries in our exhibits and events", said Anne. "Happily art that is 'out of the ordinary' is in abundant supply among the talented artists in our adopted community."

Both owners take seriously what they see as Grey Gallery's role as a 'gathering space' for local and sometimes visiting artists and clients. "Social interaction, dialogue and enjoyment are essential ingredients in a successful gallery", observed Anne. "Much of this has been hampered by Covid restrictions so we have had to be creative in this regard as well. Our adjacent garden and proximity to River District events have been wonderful in enabling us to facilitate outdoor exhibits and socializing – weather permitting of course."

#### OWEN SOUND ARTISTS' COOP

The Owen Sound Artists Co-op has nurtured local artists with remarkable success since 1994. One prominent beneficiary of this stimulating artistic environment, among many others, is the Co-op's current manager Jana Miller, who was welcomed to Co-op membership as a young artist through juried evaluation while still in high school. "Having been a member artist for 22 of the Co-op's 27 years, I truly consider many of our past and present members to be family", she said recently. Echoing that thought, former member Steve Irvine, who was one of the Co-op's founders, recently described the Co-op affectionately as a community within the Grey Bruce arts community.

Located in the historic McKay building on 2nd Avenue East, the Artists' Co-op features the work of 45 local member artists and artisans who live and work in both Grey and Bruce Counties. Media represented include ceramics, glass, jewellery, metal, painting, photography, stamp collage, textiles, wood and beeswax candles. There is always an artist on duty when you visit, and most members are able to speak with passion and authority about their fellow members' creations.

Local residents and tourists are drawn to the uniqueness of the space and the vast array of quality art and crafts created by Co-op members. Many visitors are intrigued by a recent addition to the space, a 'funky' Food Gallery which displays and sells locally produced, non-perishable food products and natural body products. Among many regular, forward-looking initiatives the Co-op hosts monthly guest artists and displays exhibitions frequently in the spectacular Legacy Gallery. Covid slowed this outreach somewhat over the past two years but Co-op members persevered resiliently and have emerged relatively unscathed.

To best showcase the history of the McKay Building, Co-op members found and now highlight items from the old department store in its bustling heyday. At the front of the attractive space, there's a display case with fascinating antique merchandise. Particularly enticing is the old, originally water-based, money rail hanging from the ceiling. Once used to deliver change to cash customers, it was an ingenious conveyance long before email transfers and debit cards spelled its demise.

After graduating from the Jewellery and Metals Program at Georgian College in Barrie, Jana Miller returned to Owen Sound and applied her learning at a local jewellery store for several years before taking on her manager role. She draws on nature for inspiration, using everything from vintage beads to watch parts, and gives new life to scrap silver and gold. Based on her own life-altering youthful experience one of Jana's personal priorities over the nine months she has been Manager has been to rejuvenate the Co-op's efforts to engage more local young people in the arts. She was instrumental in reintroducing the Next Generation Program aimed at helping emerging artists by giving them an opportunity to show and sell their work in a professional gallery setting. To participate, a young artist must be between the ages of 14 and 24 and reside in Grey or Bruce counties.

Clearly, Grey Gallery and the Owen Sound Artists' Co-op each embodies an almost magical combination of artistry, entrepreneurship and collaboration. What's particularly evident as a common denominator is the underlying passion for art and for the Grey-Bruce community. Passion and imagination inspire hard work which leads to tangible creative results. People notice and enjoy. It's contagious!









### FILLING THE ARTISAN GAP

Creating and sharing beautiful art works makes the world a more enjoyable, less stressful place. But mastering a medium of choice and building a career in art is not easy. Someone may have natural talent, but without training and guidance their raw skills may not take them very far. In Owen Sound that's where The Georgian Bay Centre of the Arts fills the gap. It's what's called a 'community access makers space' that provides workshops and open studio spaces for beginner and experienced individuals interested in arts and crafts. Founded by Morag Budgeon and Alan McIntosh in 2019, GB Arts is further proof that Owen Sound punches far above its weight when it comes to the arts.

The creativity of Budgeon, a jewelry maker, and McIntosh, who works in metal, has taken many exciting forms. They are skilled artists, entrepreneurs and social advocates who have persevered successfully over the past four years through starting a business, acquiring and renovating a heritage building, coping with the pandemic, serving their community, and, especially, inspiring and empowering the next generation of local fine artists and artisans. They even offer delectable treats in the aptly named Palette Café, tucked into the former Kresge Department Store at 938 2nd Ave East.

Currently the Centre is home to about 20 classes monthly. These workshops provide learning opportunities to both adults and youngsters. Accomplished local artists and artisans provide insight and hands-on experience in media such as pottery, printmaking, stained glass, painting, metal work, fibre arts, and jewellery.

While GB Arts' workshops cross the full artistic spectrum Budgeon and McIntosh explicitly give highest priority to crafts. About 75 percent of classes are craft based in specialized studios, with the rest allocated to fine arts. This focus is motivated by their perception that craft is frequently under-

valued. As Morag puts it: "Too often craft has been characterized as superfluous and fluffy so Alan and I have chosen to give craft back its well-deserved gravitas."


"The fundamental goal of our not for profit organization is to give more to our community than we take", said Alan. "Having this Centre as a space to be creative, to meet people, to come and engage in artistic pursuits, that's a social enterprise at its best because it helps our community. After all that we have been through, it's so exhilarating to be in close proximity with fellow artists and thriving again".

Looking forward, Morag and Alan share an optimistic vision of Owen Sound's artistic future. If over the next few years GB Arts, the Artists' Co-Op, Grey Gallery and many other community partners can continue to collaborate to attain a critical mass of outstanding artists and artisans, they believe the clear opportunity exists for the 'Scenic City' to follow the path of artistic centres like Banff and Haliburton. "Any significant upswing in the arts sector has a tsunami effect on the local economy, impacting hugely the service sector, retail, hospitality, and tourism industries." We can do the same.

Last summer, Bill and I had the pleasure of visiting Owen Sound and area where we explored the beautiful Inglis Falls Conservation Area and Sauble Falls Provincial Park. I was taken away by the breathtaking beauty of these magnificent works of nature.

That is why I am proud that all through 2022, tourists who come to visit Owen Sound can take advantage of the Ontario Staycation personal income tax credit, which helps Ontarians get up to 20 per cent back on their eligible accommodation expenses for leisure stays around the province.

These are the kinds of investments that will be critical to overcoming the effects of the pandemic so that we can all get back to enjoying what makes Owen Sound a world class destination in our world class province.



# ONTARIO STAYCATIONS GET A WELCOME BOOST

Did you know that the Ontario government has introduced a temporary tax credit encouraging residents and families to take short-term trips within the province to stimulate the tourism and hospitality sector while the pandemic winds down? Labelled the 'Ontario Staycation Tax Credit for 2022' it permits residents to claim 20 percent of the costs of accommodation, such as a hotel, motel, resort, lodge, bed-and-breakfast, cottage or campground when filing their personal Income Tax and Benefit Return for 2022.

Ontarians are eligible to claim up to up a maximum of \$1,000 as individuals or \$2,000 with a spouse/common-law partner or children yielding a credit of \$200 or \$400, respectively. This benefit can be for one or multiple trips. The stay must be under a month. "If a family of three or four plans to spend \$1000 and they learn they will get back \$200 they might end up spending the \$1200," said Tourism Minister Lisa MacLeod. "I think we'll start to see that money circulating across the province."

The tax credit will only be available for 2022 and only applies to leisure stays. Business travel is not eligible. It also does not apply to timeshare agreements, staying on a boat, train or other vehicle that can be self-propelled. However, under some circumstances Airbnb rentals can qualify.

Anyone who is an Ontario resident on December 31, 2022, is eligible to make the claim. But only one person per family can do so. For further information go to:




